Historically, the Bosphorus was also known as the "Strait of Constantinople", or the Thracian Bosphorus, in order to distinguish it from the Cimmerian Bosphorus in Crimea. These are expressed in Herodotus' Histories, 4.83; as Bosphorus Thracius, Bosphorus Thraciae, and Ἰσθμὸς τῆς Θρακίας, Ἰσθμὸς τῆς Ἀσίας, respectively.
